

Hood Theological Seminary Receives \$1,000,000 Lilly

Endowment Grant

Salisbury, NC (August 31, 2020) – Hood Theological Seminary (HTS) in Salisbury, NC, has received a \$1million grant from Lilly Endowment Inc. This generous grant will



help HTS to address key strategic initiatives, ranging from endowed student scholarships, enhancing an endowed faculty chair, updating instructional and communication technology, addressing major campus safety and building stability and appearance issues, and attending to major deferred maintenance projects.

The grant is aimed at giving the seminary rich creative space to breathe and to imagine itself functioning beyond a modality of adequacy but existing in a realm where dreams and plans are sketched in reality and are grounded by excellence.

"This funding is a lifeline and caring investment for HTS. It will support the seminary as it addresses many vital priorities and moves to a more viable future by modernizing and extending our educational delivery as an institution that is a relevant, attractive place of spiritual formation, academic excellence, service to the church, and a witness to hurting communities," said Hood's President Dr. Vergel L. Lattimore. "Lilly Endowment has a distinguished record of supportive commitment to transformative theological education that is focused on empowering the church to be a leveling force in society."


HTS is among the six Historically Black Theological Institutions (HBTIs) that are being adversely affected by COVID-19. Moreover, our constituent students predominantly come from marginalized communities and churches whose members are experiencing negative residual health, economic, and social disparities. Lilly Endowment has acknowledged how HTS has, with meager resources, provided impressive theological training and leadership for more than 135 years. This 21st century contribution promises to be a game changer for the mission of HTS: "... preparing women and men for bold, creative leadership for the Christian church for a diverse world."

Hood Theological Seminary, located at 1810 Lutheran Synod Drive in Salisbury, NC, is a graduate and professional school sponsored by the African Methodist Episcopal Zion Church (A.M.E. Zion). The Seminary bears the name of a renowned bishop, James Walker Hood, who in 1879 inspired the creation of the Seminary's forerunner – Zion Wesley Institute. The Seminary offers the Master of Divinity, Master of Theological Studies, and Doctor of Ministry degrees. The Seminary is approved by the University Senate of the United Methodist Church and accredited by the Commission on Accrediting of the Association of Theological School in the United States and Canada. 

Community Protectors Project Positions: Two positions--Program Facilitator and Social Media Fellow.

PROJECT OVERVIEW - The Community Protectors Project is a faith-based community organizing program based in Gadsden, Alabama. Community Protectors is looking beyond charity to create a grassroots Christian coalition that centers antiracist and mutual aid work in our local community. Through bible studies based in liberation theology, local Christians will join with members of their own congregation to learn about Christ's calls to action around white supremacy and economic exploitation as well as work together to address these issues internally. Next, via leadership trainings and community organizing classes, willing participants will come together to develop the tangible skills and trusting relationships to respond collectively to Christ's anti-racist and anti-poverty mandates. Finally, these leaders will convene in a local council that uses anti-racist action and mutual aid to build the beloved community here at home. Supported by the Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation's Voices for Economic Opportunity Grand Challenge, funding will be used to compensate all project participants for their time as well as support three part-time positions--two of which are currently looking to be filled! 


